PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Knight called for and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Tim Smith made motion to approve the minutes of the October 17, 2017 meeting as submitted. Brenda Thompson seconded, all voted in favor and motion carried.

APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT STREETS – FALLS SUBDIVISION

Mayor Knight advised the council that Chuck Jarrell had inspected the streets in the Falls Subdivision and said that everything looked good. Brenda Thompson made motion to approve the Resolution to Authorize Acceptance Of Certain Road Improvements As Public Road Right Of Way And For Other Uses. Tony Sells

seconded, all voted in favor and motion carried.

SPLOST MEETING INFORMATION

Councilman Bruce Alznauer gave an update on the SPLOST meeting he and the City Clerk attended. The new SPLOST will go on the ballot in May 2018. If it passes Rutledge would receive 2%. He advised the

council that the list for SPLOST needed to be ready by January 5,2018.

The current SPLOST expires in March 2019.

ELECTION RESULTS

Mayor Knight advised that the official complete election results were in for the November 7, 2017 election. The Rutledge results are for mayor Bruce Alznauer, Brandy Owens for council post #3 and Tim Smith for council post # 3.

Mayor Knight also advised the members that the traffic engineer had been contacted in regards to doing a speed hump study.
